PROJECT

UNIVERSITY STUDENTS FROM TANEGASHIMA X HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS ON THE ISLAND

In the 2024 academic year, we developed an environmental education program utilizing a grant from the LUSH Charity Bank. A total of 24 participants, including 18 university students from Noraneko and 6 volunteer students from Tanegashima High School, took part in this program. Using the Tanegashima beach "Mihamama" as a field, they deepened their understanding of environmental conservation. Activities were usually conducted online, and during long vacations, university students originally from Tanegashima returned home. Fieldwork such as beach cleaning and marine debris surveys were carried out locally. Through workshops, participants not only generated concrete ideas for marine environmental conservation but also established a reciprocal learning relationship among the young people of Tanegashima.

SETTING THE STAGE AT MIHAMAMA!

LEARNING TOGETHER ACROSS GRADE LEVELS!

On March 2, 2025, we conducted a workshop at Nishinoomote Citizens' Hall, followed by a beach clean-up and marine debris survey at Mihamama Coast! A total of 16 people participated in the workshop on the day, and students from Kagoshima University who were visiting the island for research also came to observe. During the discussion about the richness of Tanegashima's ocean, a lively exchange of opinions took place across different grade levels and fields of study!




ANALYSIS

SURVEY RESULTS FOR PARTICIPANTS

87% of the participants in this environmental education program responded that their "interest in the environment has increased," and another 13% evaluated it as "agree." Furthermore, regarding their intent to participate in future programs, 80% responded "strongly agree," and 13% responded "agree," indicating a high level of overall interest. (n=16)

SUMMARY

FOCUSING ON THE SHARED THEME OF HUMANITY: ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES
